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Caesarea Maritima

- Herod the Great built everything seen. He was the Herod that ruled when Jesus was born.
- Greatest tragedy was that he built a hippodrome in Jerusalem, went through all the noble families, and told them they would be killed when he died.
- King Agrippa ruled when Herod died, and in that prison, Paul spent two years of his life.

Near Nazareth

- Theological Answer to four gospels: has to do with numbers; the totality of the human experience. Practical Answer: to resonate differently with humans.
- Matthew: focuses on the five sermons of Jesus
- Mark: focuses on the ministry, the trip to Jerusalem, his time at crucifixion
- Luke: refers to the life of Jesus in the life of the church
- John: 7 miracles, 7 I Am sayings; relates to Eastern mindset

Cana

- John 2; John 4 - first two numbered miracles of John.
- This is a journey through discipleship.

Kibbutz Lavi

- How is Jesus fulfilling the law? Jesus is saying, "I am the law."
- The core issue is not the behavior, it's the intention.
- When Jesus said, "Love your enemy," he meant it as a verb, not an emotion.

Mount Arbel

- 2/3rds of what Jesus said and did took place here.
- Jesus likely fed the 5,000 across the water from this place.
- Mount of Beatitudes - likely where Jesus preached the Sermon on the Mount.

Mount of Beatitudes

- Matthew 6 - dealt with the two primal needs of everyone: recognition and security.

Magdala

- Mary Magdalene is famous because she was the first one Jesus appeared to after the resurrection...in all four gospels.
- None of us have any excuses for not doing what God has called us to do.
